4-H Council Dates for 2024-2025

Monday, November 4, 2024; Monday, January 6, 2025; Monday, March 3, 2025; Monday, May 5, 2025; Monday, June 30, 2025; Monday, August 18, 2025 (Labor Day is September 1)

Each club is allowed to have 5 voting representatives: 3 youth and 2 adults. .

4-H TRIPle E Excellent Exchange Experience

Did you know that there is a multi-county 4-H Interstate Exchange Trip group that 4-H youth can join?

4-Hers who are 12 years old or will be by June 10 this year, through those who are 18 4-H age on January 1 are eligible. Our group has recently planned, organized, fund-raised for, and participated in very fun, successful, enjoyable, educational, and awesome road trips to Ohio in 2023 and North Carolina in 2024, where we stayed with 4-H families there to learn about their customs, lifestyle, 4-H activities, and toured educational, historical sites in their states, plus en-route.

For the week of July 6 THIS summer, we will be hosting 4-Hers and their chaperones from North Carolina and Pennsylvania, then in 2026 we will travel to Eastern Pennsylvania. They are very excited to travel here and to host us next year!!!

We are currently seeking more 4-Hers and families to become involved in our program. The only cost is a \$75 application fee per 4-Her, and requirement to help with fundraisers when we have them. Travel expenses are covered by 4-H TRIPle E, and admission fees to visit attractions are paid by our group when we host, and by the other state when we travel there.

Please note: There is a need to host adult chaperones, so if you don't have a 4-Her in your family to serve as a host, but you would like to become involved in our program by hosting an adult 4-H parent or leader, please let me know!!!

Beef Tagging and Weigh In 2025

Market Beef -- Riley County 4-H beef weigh-in and tagging will be held from 1:00 to 3:00 p.m. on Saturday, February 15 at the Riley County Fairgrounds. All market beef animals (both steers and market heifers) that will be shown at the Riley County Fair must be weighed and tagged on this date.

Heifers – Reminder: NEW LAST YEAR –All commercial (unregistered) breeding heifers need to be tagged by May 1. We prefer that you bring them to the tagging event on February 15. Registered heifers must be owned by June 15 and registered in the 4-Hers name by June 15 if they are to be shown in the registered classes. (If there is a chance you might not get registration papers by June 15, then we recommend having them tagged with an official 4-H ear tag by May 1.)

Bucket Calves – Bucket calves must be born between January 1 and May 1, and need to be tagged with an official 4-H ear tag by May 15. They don't have to come to weigh-in (but they can). They may be tagged at home with a non-family member verifying the tagging. Stop by the Extension Office to get a tag. We also have a tagger you may borrow.

To Continue Receiving 4-H Emails and Newsletter—please act!

Starting in early March, we will be transitioning to using 4-H Online for all email communications. This will include newsletters, reminders, announcements, and more. Emails will only be sent to families who are currently enrolled in 4-H.

To ensure you continue receiving these important updates, please complete the enrollment process as soon as possible. <u>Enrollment Guide PDF</u>

If your 4-Her has aged out of the program but you'd still like to receive 4-H emails, please let me know, and we'll make sure you remain on the list.

YQCA Program

The YQCA program is a national, multi-species youth livestock quality assurance program available for youth 7-21 years of age. The program focuses on food safety, animal well-being, and character development. This is annual training, as the learning modules change each year. The curriculum grows with young people as they advance through the program.

In the absence of an agriculture agent, Riley County 4-H youth will be recommended to receive certification online at: **yqcaprogram.org**.

7-year-olds must receive training in person. For those youth or others who wish to have an in-person option, information for that can be found below.

Who needs to attend? – All Riley County 4-H members exhibiting market livestock (beef, sheep, swine, goats) at the county fair must attend a quality assurance training annually to receive valid certification. Also, all exhibitors attending the Kansas State Fair or KJLS must be certified annually.

Riley County Certification Options

Online Course - \$12/child – youth complete age-specific knowledge builders, skills labs, and quizzes online at their convenience. It must be completed on a computer with high-speed internet access; Google Chrome is encouraged for best compatibility.

<u>Test-out Exam</u> – It is only available online for 12 and 15-year-olds (first year of the intermediate and senior age divisions). Youth have one opportunity to pass a 50-question exam.

Youth Entrepreneurship Challenge (YEC) 2025

Are you a high school-age youth living or attending school in Riley County? Have you ever had an idea for a business or product, but haven't had the outlet or guidance to put together a business plan or prototype? Well HERE is your chance to make it happen...and earn some MONEY!

In partnership with the Manhattan Chamber of Commerce, Riley County Extension, Network Kansas, SPARK and generous donations from local donors, we will be hosting our 8th Youth Entrepreneurship Challenge (YEC) event on Wednesday, March 12 at the Manhattan Town Center Mall. Participants will have the opportunity to compete against other young entrepreneurs for \$3,000 + in cash.

The competition consists of (3) components including; the submission of a simple business plan, the creation of a tabletop trade show booth, and finally a 5-6 minutes formal presentation in front of a panel of judges. All three of these components will be judged based on a specific set of predetermined criteria.

If this sounds like something you would like to be a part of, I would love to get you started by sharing event specifics, including the scoring rubrics used by judges, but also the template for creating a solid business plan.

To recap, if you're high school age, living or attending school in Riley County, are interested in business or entrepreneurship, and are willing to create a business plan, tradeshow booth, and present a 5-6 minute presentation, you will have the chance to win a portion of the \$3,000 + in cash. 
Funds raised will support 4-H club activities, community service projects, and more.

YQCA is excited to announce the 2025 Scholarship Program available to high school seniors and students enrolled in a 2-4 year university or certification program.

You must be a high school senior up to 21 year of age. You also must have an active YQCA certification at the time of application (2025) and have had active YQCA certification the previous two years (2023, 2024). As a high school senior, the essay question regarding your future plans to enter the agriculture industry or commitment to a university will be considered for eligibility.
