Citizenship In Action

The purpose of the event is for Kansas youth to learn how the state legislative process works and how their voice and participation in decision-making can make a difference in their local communities. Riley County 4-Hers Participate in the American Rabbit Breeders' Association in Louisville

Cooper Nemacheck (Leondardville Hustlers)

Cooper won the 1st place individual award in Breed Identification for the Intermediate level as well as being on the 1st place Intermediate Breed ID team with other KS 4-Hers. He was also awarded 1st place for the Management contest for District 5 (includes Kansas, Missouri, and Illinois) for an Average Size rabbitry, and 3rd Runner Up nationally for the Intermediate age division for the Achievement Contest.



Amaree Wiebers (Bonfire)

Amaree was on the 4th place Junior Quiz Bowl team. She won 1st place in the Princess royalty contest.

Alena Wiebers (Bonfire)

Alena won 1st place in the District 5 (includes Kansas, Missouri, and Illinois) Management contest for a Limited Size rabbitry and placed 4th Runner Up overall nationally in that contest. She also won 4th Runner Up for her individual score in the Senior Division of the Breed Identification contest and was a member of Kansas's Senior Judging Team that placed in the top 6 nationally.

Jayde Mongeau (Leonardville Hustlers)

Jayde was on the 1st place Junior team for Breed Identification and the 5th place Junior Quiz Bowl Team.

All four of these kids also participated in the national Royalty contests for their respective age divisions. This contest combines their scores from a written application, Breed Identification contest, Showmanship (for juniors) or Judging Contest (for intermediates and seniors), a written test, and an interview. Jayde received 3rd Runner Up in the Princess (age 8-10) category and Amaree was the national winner of that contest. Cooper was the 1st Runner Up for the Duke category (age 11-14), and Alena was 4th Runner Up for the Queen category (age 15-18).

Leaders and Parents

Consider in January

Youth Entrepreneurship Challenge (YEC) 2025

Are you a high school-age youth living or attending school in Riley County? Have you ever had an idea for a business or product, but haven't had the outlet or guidance to put together a business plan or prototype? Well HERE is your chance to make it happen...and earn some MONEY!

In partnership with the Manhattan Chamber of Commerce, Riley County Extension, Network Kansas, SPARK and generous donations from local donors, we will be hosting our 8th Youth Entrepreneurship Challenge (YEC) event on Wednesday, March 12th at the Manhattan Town Center Mall. Participants will have the opportunity to compete against other young entrepreneurs for \$3,000 + in cash.

The competition consist of (3) components including; the submission of a simple business plan, the creation of a tabletop trade show booth, and finally a 5-6 minutes formal presentation in front of a panel of judges. All three of these components will be judged based on a specific set of predetermined criteria.

If this sounds like something you would like to be a part of, I would love to get you started by sharing event specifics, including the scoring rubrics use by judges, but also the template for creating a solid business plan.

To recap, if you're high school age, living or attending school in Riley County, are interested in business or entrepreneurship, and are willing to create a business plan, tradeshow booth, and present a 5-6 minute presentation, you will have the chance to win a portion of the \$3,000 + in cash. YQCA is excited to announce the 2025 Scholarship Program available to high school seniors and students enrolled in a 2-4 year university or certification program.

You must be a high school senior up to 21 year of age. You also must have an active YQCA certification at the time of application (2025) and have had active YQCA certification the previous two years (2023, 2024). As a high school senior, the essay question regarding your future plans to enter the agriculture industry or commitment to a university will be considered for eligibility.
