4-H Horse Judging Contest

Kansas 4-H, Kansas Quarter Horse Association, and EquiFest of Kansas are teaming up to host the 2025 Kansas State 4-H Horse Judging Contest. The Contest will be held March 21, 2025, in conjunction with EquiFest of Kansas in Salina.

Two contests are available- an open contest and a 4-H contest. Kansas 4-H members age 9-18 are invited to participate in the 4-H contest, and may also participate in the open contest. Youth of any age are eligible to participate in the open contest hosted by Kansas Quarter Horse Association. Cost to enter the 4-H contest is \$25. **Registration closes March** 7. <u>Please register here.</u>

This is considered the state horse judging contest for Kansas 4-H. The first place team will have the option to represent Kansas at the Western National 4-H Horse Judging Contest in Denver next January.

Please be sure to read all rules prior to entry- 4-H Horse Judging rules.

Making Memories is What It's All About! with Host Families

For many families, getting to know a young person from another country in their homes creates memories that last a lifetime. Some of those memories are of attending 4-H events, county fairs, club meetings, and 4-H socials with their visitors. 4-H exchange programs are with 4-H type programs, and their members hope to learn about 4-H, improve English language, see how Kansas families live, and make friends. Mostly they do what their host siblings do. They don't expect to be entertained or travel around the state or country, but many families find hosting a good excuse to visit local attractions and historic sites. If a short vacation is planned, the exchange visitor may go along. Opportunities are available for family members in the right age groups to visit exchange partner countries for home stays on outbound exchanges in future years.

Kansas inbound exchanges this summer will bring teens from the following youth programs to our state for the dates listed below:

- Costa Rica's 4-S, June 25-July19, 2025
- Norway's 4H, June 25-July 19, 2025
- Taiwan's 4-H, July 3-August 2, 2025
- Japan's Labo and LEX, July 21-August 16, 2025

Youth coming from Costa Rica, Norway, and Taiwan will be 15-18. Host families for them should have a host sibling the same gender and within two-three years of their visitor's age. The Japanese visitors are likely to be 12-16. There will be adult chaperones with the groups for travel. They can be placed with families with or without children at home, usually for half of the exchange period each for their own exchange experience while they support their exchange members.

Apply to Host Families who have hosted a States' 4-H exchange previously should need only to update their applications and add exchange hosting preferences for 2025.

4-H TRIPle E Excellent Exchange Experience

Did you know that there is a multi-county 4-H Interstate Exchange Trip group that 4-H youth can join?

4-Hers who are 12 years old or will be by June 10 this year, through those who are 18 4-H age on January 1 are eligible. Our group has recently planned, organized, fund-raised for, and participated in very fun, successful, enjoyable, educational, and awesome road trips to Ohio in 2023 and North Carolina in 2024, where we stayed with 4-H families there to learn about their customs, lifestyle, 4-H activities, and toured educational, historical sites in their states, plus en-route.

For the week of July 6 THIS summer, we will be hosting 4-Hers and their chaperones from North Carolina and Pennsylvania, then in 2026 we will travel to Eastern Pennsylvania. They are very excited to travel here and to host us next year!!!

We are currently seeking more 4-Hers and families to become involved in our program. The only cost is a \$75 application fee per 4-Her, and requirement to help with fundraisers when we have them. Travel expenses are covered by 4-H TRIPle E, and admission fees to visit attractions are paid by our group when we host, and by the other state when we travel there.

YOCA Program

The YQCA program is a national, multi-species youth livestock quality assurance program available for youth 7-21 years of age. The program focuses on food safety, animal well-being, and character development. This is annual training, as the learning modules change each year. The curriculum grows with young people as they advance through the program. In the absence of an agriculture agent, Riley County 4-H youth will be recommended to receive certification online at: **yqcaprogram.org**.

7-year-olds must receive training in person. For those youth or others who wish to have an in-person option, information for that can be found below.

Who needs to attend? – All Riley County 4-H members exhibiting market livestock (beef, sheep, swine, goats) at the county fair must attend a quality assurance training annually to receive valid certification. Also, all exhibitors attending the Kansas State Fair or KJLS must be certified annually.

Riley County Certification Options

<u>Online Course</u> - \$12/child – youth complete age-specific knowledge builders, skills labs, and quizzes online at their convenience. It must be completed on a computer with high-speed internet access; Google Chrome is encouraged for best compatibility.

<u>Test-out Exam</u> – It is only available online for 12 and 15-year-olds (first year of the intermediate and senior age divisions). Youth have one opportunity to pass a 50-question exam.
